About Tulku

Karla Refojo, the creator of Tulku—is a painter, sculptor and meditator. She travels regularly to Nepal where she works with Newari master craftsmen to broaden her knowledge and connection with the source of her inspiration. As part of the ancient lineage of artists whose path in Life is to create sacred objects and share them with the world, Karla’s intention with Tulku is to work with other such artists to provide people with sacred art to wear.

Blessings

Tulku jewelry is caringly hand-crafted with consciousness by several loving hands, hearts, and souls to awaken its powerful quality. In keeping with Karla’s intention to bring the greatest blessings, support and peace to the people who wear Tulku, each amulet is carved in repousse by master artist **Rajendra Bajracharya**, a 17th generation Buddhist priest; then blessed by a Nepalese holy woman known as **Mata**, thought to be an incarnation of the Divine Mother in the form of Vajrayogini. From her small home in the most ancient part of Kathmandu, she performs sacred healing work and is a channeler and seer for local people. The pure intention and Light she pours into the amulets bring blessings and upliftment to all who wear Tulku jewelry.

These amulets are imbued with the power inherent in traditions where there is no separation between pure spirituality and the act of creation. Through wearing these amulets, that power supports, inspires, and protects us on our own particular Paths in Life.

Repoussé

Repoussé is a metal working technique where flat sheets of metal are crafted into three dimensional images by using chisels of various shapes and sizes. It is a laborious art form that requires great patience to master and tremendous skill to execute with refinement. The variations in texture and small surface “imperfections” are evidence of the chisel and hammer work and are hallmarks of repoussé. Though it is rarely practiced in our contemporary world, within the Newari community in Nepal it is a tradition that is passed down over generations from father to son. Tulku works with these master craftsmen to bring this ancient art to the new world.

Tulku “The form body of a Buddha”

In the Tibetan tradition, a tulku is the recognized reincarnation of a past Buddhist master. The new incarnation takes rebirth to bring blessings and benefit to all sentient beings. Tulku jewels—like the name they embody—represent the rebirth of spirit into a new form. They are tools to remind us of our divine nature which is unbounded by time or space.
